FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Who can apply for M. Sc. (Physics) entrance examination?

- B. Sc. (Physics), B. Sc. (Chemistry), B. Sc. (Mathematics) or B.E. (in any branch) passed or appeared students can apply for entrance examination.

2. Should I eligible to take admission in any affiliated college of University of Pune after giving entrance examination conducted by Department of Physics, University of Pune?

- No. This entrance is specifically for M. Sc. (Physics) of Department of Physics, University of Pune only and not for the affiliated colleges.

3. Is reserve category is applicable for all states in India?

- No. Reservation is applicable for Maharashtra domicile SC, ST, DT/NT, OBC category as per the reservation policies of Government of Maharashtra and 3 % for physically handicapped students. Noncrimy layer certificate is necessary for OBC, NT(C), NT (D) category students.

4. Is M. Sc. (Physics) part time or full time course?

- This is full time course. Lectures/Practical (Lab. work) timing is from 9.00 am to 6.00 pm.

5. Do M. Sc. student gets stipend?

- No.

6. Can final year B.Sc. / B.E. students apply for the test?

- Yes. Final year B.Sc. / B.E. students can apply for the test. If they cleared the test their admission will be subject to their final year results.

7. What is the date and timing of Entrance exam?

- Entrance exam. is scheduled to be held on 4th June, 2008. Duration of examination is 3 hours i.e. 2.00 pm. to 5.00 pm. at different centers.

8. Which are the examination centers?

- Pune, Mumbai, Nashik, Ahmednagar, Nagpur, Sangali, Aurangabad, Delhi, Calcutta and Bangalore.

9. What is the syllabus for the entrance examination?

- Graduation Level Physics Syllabus.

10. Is it possible to change examination center?

- Normally no.

11. What will be the nature of the questions?

- Objective type questions - choose one correct answer out of the 4 options.

12. How many questions will be in the question paper?

- 50 questions. All questions are compulsory.

13. Is there any negative marking system?

- Yes.

14. How is the marking system?

- If students who attempted "A" no. of question and if "C" question solve with the correct answer then he can score marks (4 C - A).

15. What is the last date of submission of online application form?

- 29th May, 2008.

16. Can I apply after 29th May 2008?

- Yes. Apply online and do not send Demand Draft and other documents to Department of Physics, University of Pune. Bring the printed copy of form, Demand Draft and documents at the centre. University representative will collect before the commencement of Examination.

17. What is the last date of submission of application form with requisite Demand Draft to the Department of Physics, University of Pune?

- 31st May, 2008.

19. How I can get the hall ticket?

- You can print the Hall Ticket on June 1st onwards.

20. What is the address of Examination Centre?

- The address of examination centre will be printed on Hall Ticket. You have to affix your photo on Hall Ticket and attest the same.

21. What is percentage of reservation for backward class students?

- 50 % reservation will be followed at every stage as per Govt. of Maharashtra resolution which will be applicable to only the students having domicile of state of Maharashtra or caste certificate issued by competent authority of State of Maharashtra.

22. Is there any reservation for Kashmir migrate students?

- Yes, one seat will be reserved for Kashmir migrate students over and above intake capacity.

23. Is there any difference in the merit list of University of Pune students and other university students?

- Yes

24. May I know the intake capacity of the Department of Physics, University of Pune?

- Total 90 students.

25. What is the intake capacity of Pune University students?

- 70 % of the total intake capacity.

26. Who is the student of University of Pune?

- The student passed 10th and 12th std exam. from state of Maharashtra and B. Sc. from University of Pune or domicile of state of Maharashtra and B. Sc. from university of Pune.
